

Capital Campaign Kickoff Reception at University Club in Chicago

Over 60 Acacia Illinois alumni gathered in downtown Chicago on the evening of August 1, 2012, to celebrate the purchase of the new Acacia House, located at 302 East Armory. The event was held at the University Club and alumni from all eras were represented.

The evening provided an opportunity to renew old friendships, meet fellow alumni for the first time and to share stories that spanned decades. Capital Campaign Co-Chairmen **Dan Bayston '80** and **Mike Duncan '74** thanked those

in attendance, including lead donor **Jim Wormley '60**, for making it possible to purchase the new home. Alumni were also updated on previous fundraising efforts and the renewed push to raise enough money in the final phase of the campaign to meaningfully reduce the \$1.75 million mortgage, provide funding for completing the conversion of the house from a sorority home to a fraternity house, and replenish the capital reserves.



Bob concluded, "The crops are doing reasonably well considering the lack of rain, but I noticed a degree of aging among the fraternity brothers."


