# **ILLINOIS CHAPTER'S STATUS TODAY**

Over the past two years, the Illinois Chapter has weathered significant challenges, transformed, and continued to grow. As we shared in the summer 2020 alumni letter and spring 2021 issue of *the Hello*, there was an unfortunate hazing incident involving two brothers that resulted in their removal from the Acacia brotherhood due to their selfish and irresponsible actions toward a new member—which fell short of Acacia Fraternity's high standards. The new member has received the full support of the chapter and remains an active brother and strong leader in the chapter today. While the Acacia International Fraternity has acknowledged the wrongdoing of the two deactivated members and has assisted the chapter in moving forward, the university had a different response, resulting in the removal of Acacia's standing as a recognized organization until reinstatement in 2024.

The fall 2021 semester marks the third semester in a row that Illinois Chapter has been operating without official university recognition. To be clear, Acacia International Fraternity leadership recognizes Illinois Chapter as an active group since the chapter's charter has remained intact since our founding in 1906. However, we understand alumni have questions about the impact of the university's sanction, and we would like to address those concerns. We want to make all alumni aware of the current chapter status and what this means for our brothers today.

#### What does this unrecognized status mean?

Being unrecognized means Acacia Fraternity no longer operates under the supervision of the Interfraternity Council (IFC) or the University of Illinois.

### What impact does this have on the chapter?

Our chapter is fully functional and operational as before. The biggest change,

however, has been not having to communicate with IFC. Therefore, our chapter and executive board must be more accountable, and must self-regulate our operations on campus with the help of the Alumni Housing Corporation Board and Acacia International Fraternity. When our recognition was initially removed, our reputation on campus was up in the air as we are one of a few chapters on campus operating without recognition from the university. However, as the situation resolved and time passed, our reputation and standing within the Greek system at the University of Illinois is the same as it was before. Our social relations are still very strong, our philanthropic presence on campus is still important, and potential new members are still eager to join our brotherhood.

#### Can the chapter recruit?

Yes. Illinois Chapter continues to recruit and held a very successful fall recruitment. Acacia welcomed 30 Fall new members, bringing the chapter total to 130 members.

#### Can brothers be involved on campus and in the community?

Yes. This fall, our brothers have been participating in various philanthropy events for other Greek houses. A group of brothers participated in the men's soccer intramural league, and unfortunately lost in the semifinals. Many of our members are also active in various business fraternities, RSOs, and other academic clubs. Therefore, our presence on campus extends deeper than Acacia, and our members are doing great things for our community.

Illinois Chapter is committed to virtue, knowledge, and truth. We will grow from this experience and continue the strong legacy that alumni, like you, have built for our brotherhood.
