


# Preserve Our Legacy Secure Our Future

#### HOW WE ARRIVED TO TODAY

It's been a long journey to find a permanent residence for Illinois Chapter in the new millennium. Beginning in 2008, our brothers rallied around the need to purchase a new chapter house. By 2012, we had acquired our current home at 302 E. Armory and brothers continued to support necessary renovations and updates. We are eternally grateful for the 240 men who made a commitment during this time, helping to raise over \$1.8 million in support. While our Alumni Housing Corporation Board has worked diligently to purchase and renovate the house, we continue to evaluate and plan for future improvements of our facility.



#### PRESERVING OUR LEGACY

To begin this next phase for Acacia, we are pleased to announce the *Preserve Our Legacy, Secure Our Future* capital campaign. This second capital campaign will help us finish the work from the previous effort while meeting the needs of the undergraduates today and position ourselves to remain competitive on campus. Our plan is to build an addition that will connect the east and west wings through a covered entryway, unifying the house. Additional funds raised will go towards renovations and house maintenance.

#### **HOW YOU CAN HELP**

The Alumni Housing Corporation Board is ready to take on this vital project, but we cannot do it without you. Early commitments from 29 alumni have already raised \$430,000. This is a good start, and now we need your assistance to reach our campaign goal of \$1 million. # **House Updates**

### Summer 2022 Was Full of Activity

his summer, we removed the old, decommissioned boiler, creating additional storage space in the mechanical room. Repairs were made to the hot water recirculating pump, as it had bad bearings. I also had the masonry wall on the front repointed and recaulked to eliminate damage due to water and ice; the mason did a nice job. All the yearly certifications and inspections have been completed.

Stanley Pileggi is still working with the insurance company on a \$200,000 settlement for window replacement due to hail damage. Hopefully, that work can happen next summer.

We have purchased and installed a new oven, worktable, and freezer for the kitchen. The old oven and freezer were shot and not worth repairing. This will help with the configuration of the room and give the chef some additional prep area; the culinary company was very helpful with this effort. I was trying to get new quarry tile flooring installed in the kitchen, but due to supply chain issues, the material was not available in time—so we will try to get it done over winter break.

The VCT flooring in the dishwasher area has been replaced as well as the base and damaged plaster. This way, it will look neat and clean when viewing from the dining room. We also installed new metal tables in the dining area to help keep things cleaner.

At the time of writing, I am awaiting a quote from ADT on a new camera system so we can have easier access to see what is going on.
